## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

All exhibitors are encouraged to read the **RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY** and to carefully note requirements of each of the CLASSES (see pages 22 - 25). If anything is not clear please email the Marquee Manager prior to making an entry.

The Society plans and organises the Marquee each year and invites all local garden and allotment holders to take part at this year's Show. Exhibitors from further afield are also welcome.

There are 11 sections to enter with a total of 224 classes from vegetables & flowers to home baking, arts and crafts and photography. There are 44 trophy/medals to be won together with certificates and plenty of prize monies.

All exhibits are displayed on trestle tables covered with white covering supplied by the EHS except sections **7** and **10** are on black coverings.

**Vases** - will **only** be supplied by the EHS for sections **3** and **4** (**Please remove any materials used inside the vase after use**)

**Plates** - supplied by the EHS only for sections **2**, **9** and **8** (**for cakes and biscuits**)

**Cake Covers** - will **only** be supplied by the EHS for sections **9** and **8** (**for cakes and biscuits**)

The Society is following the RHS lead in NOT permitting **OASIS** or any other floral foam and single use plastics. Alternatives can be - flower pins (frogs), sand, gravel, pebbles, marbles, beads or chicken wire or paper. Plus your own alternative.

Young exhibitors will be free to enter. Other fees remain unchanged.

**Note: All certificates will be laid on the tables after judging.**

**NEW: Exhibitors may leave their exhibits in the small marquee, situated to the rear of the main marquee after 16:45 on show day, for collection by car after 17:15. This marquee will be supervised**

- Blooms of large-flowered dahlias exceeding 260mm
- Blooms of medium-flowered dahlias exceeding 220mm
- Blooms of small-flowered dahlias exceeding 170mm
- Blooms of miniature-flowered dahlias exceeding 115mm
- Blooms of Pompon dahlias exceeding 55mm
- Use of oasis

**NOTE:** The exhibits in this Section will be judged to accord with the current NDS CLASSIFIED DIRECTORY AND JUDGING RULES. In all exhibits natural plant material **MUST** predominate


**FLOWER ARRANGEMENT Guidelines**

- Entries in all Floral Art classes, unless stated otherwise in the Schedule, can contain drapes, accessories, and more than one placement.
- All aspects of the exhibit should be within the space allowed as stated in the schedule. It is important also, not to either underfill or overfill the "3D" box of space indicated by the measurements stated for each class.
- Plant material should be in scale with containers used and also the space allocated.
- Cut plant material should have ends in water or water retaining natural substance
- Aim to have a focal point to your design with rhythmic lines drawing the eye around the design.
- Aim for a definite colour theme, rather than just a random mixture of colours.
- Aim to give variety and interest to your arrangement by using foliage/flowers with different outline shapes and textures.



## SECTION NINE

## HOME BAKE and PRESERVES (cont'd)

### JAM and CHUTNEY Guidelines

**NOTE 1: Jams and Chutney:** No cloth coverings allowed. Use EITHER a new twist top or a waxed disc with a cellophane top secured with an elastic band. All lids and jars must be sterilized.

All Jams, Jellies, Marmalade and Chutney must be filled to within 3mm of top and the full date shown on the label. All chutneys and pickles MUST be older than 2 months

**NOTE 2: Cover:** To comply with hygiene regulations, all dishes must be exhibited on a paper plate under rigid plastic cover, provided by the Society. These will be available on the table on arrival

**NOTE 3:** Where sizes are given, these are approximate, for guidance only

**NOTE 4:** Homemade Jams and Chutneys in approx 450g jars. Homemade jelly and curds in 225g jars

## CLASS 180

## DORSET APPLE CAKE RECIPE

### Ingredients

225g Chopped Bramley apple plus one apple unpeeled  
Lemon Juice  
225g Butter  
225g Caster Sugar  
4 Large Eggs  
250g Self Raising Flour  
25g Corn Flour  
Soft Brown Sugar

### Instructions

1. Chop the apple - Place in a shallow dish with some of lemon juice - Toss together. This stops apple turning brown
2. Line base of a cake tin 18cm in diameter
3. Cream together butter and caster sugar
4. Add eggs and self raising flour alternately, then add corn flour
5. Fold the chopped apple into the mixture
6. Pour into the cake tin
7. Cut segments from an unpeeled apple and soak in lemon juice
8. Arrange in a circle around the top of the cake and dust with soft brown sugar to make a crusty glaze

**Baking** - Bake for about an hour and a quarter on 170C (Fan 150C) until skewer inserted comes out clean

## RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (Please read CAREFULLY)

- GENERAL.** The Show will be conducted in accordance with the rules and standards contained in the Royal Horticultural Society's Horticultural Show Handbook (revised 2016) except where, under this Schedule, they obviously do not apply. This is a useful reference for Exhibitors and can be borrowed in return for a deposit and signature from the Hut, Washington Road, Emsworth, Sunday 10:00 to 12:00
- SUGGESTIONS TO EXHIBITORS.** Pages 41 to 50 of the Royal Horticultural Society's Handbook (revised 2016) are devoted to offering hints and suggestions to exhibitors. Novices particular, will find the comprehensive guidance most helpful. Advice covers the selection of material in the garden, the best methods of carrying and packing and the presentation of material on the show bench. Flowers, Fruits & Vegetables are all covered - together with hints of a general nature. For example, it is suggested that particular attention be paid to the number of specimens for which the Schedule asks - an exhibit consisting of either more or less will be liable to disqualification on the ground that it is 'not according to schedule' ('N.A.S.').
- INDICATOR - PRIZES, POINTS AND ENTRY FEE.** The following indicators are used alongside each Class throughout the Schedule to identify the Prize Money that will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Prize winners for the Class.(used to compute the winner of the **RHS Banksian Medal from Sections 1 to 6**); the Points that will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Prize winners for the Class (Used to compute the winner of the **B.S.Williams Trophy from Sections 3 to 6** and the winners of the 'Most Points' awards in individual Sections); and the Entry Fee for exhibiting in the Class:-

**Note: 2. Collection of Exhibits**

- Exhibitors can collect their items from the Main Marquee after 16:45. Any exhibits which remain after 17:15 will be removed and donated to local organisations by the Society.
- You can move your exhibits into the Supervised Storage located at the back of Main Marquee which will open at 16:45. Your stored items should be picked up after 17:15
- Please remember - Cars picking up exhibits will not be allowed in the showground before 17:15.

- ENTRIES.** Entry Forms, together with Entry Fees, **MUST** be delivered to one of the persons nominated on the Entry Form by 18:00 on **Monday 18th August. Earlier entry would be much appreciated.** The Horticultural Marquee Committee reserves the right to refuse an entry and, in this event, is not required to explain the reason. No late entries will be accepted.
- NOVICES CLASSES.** These are intended to encourage newcomers. A 'NOVICE' is a person who has not won a 1st prize for the particular Class at any previous Show. Previous winners of the Plessey Shield can not enter this section.

6. **STAGING OF EXHIBITS** will take place from 15:00 to 18:00 on Sunday 24th August and from 07:00 to 08:45 on Show Day. During staging, exhibitors should address any queries to one of the stewards or to any member of the committee in attendance. All exhibitors' ENTRY CARDS will be issued from a table in the Show Marquee and should be placed face downwards with the exhibits. (RHS Show Handbook (2016) (p21:6). Would EXHIBITORS who have entered for a Class but decide not to stage an exhibit please return the Card to the desk. Small white ('variety') cards will also be available. Exhibitors are requested to use these cards to 'name' their exhibits; this helps visitors to the Show later in the day. Errors in naming will not disqualify the entry but judges will regard clearness and correctness as telling in favour of an exhibitor in a close competition. If an exhibitor does not know the name of a 'cultivar' the card should bear the wording '**NAME UNKNOWN**'.
7. **EXHIBITS SHOULD BE REMOVED BETWEEN 16:45 AND 17:15** on Show Day. Earlier removal requires the Marquee Manager's approval. Exhibits which remain after 17:15, will be removed and donated to local organisations by the society
8. **KINDS AND CULTIVAR** is used throughout the Schedule for the classification of flowers as well as fruit and vegetables. Peas, carrots, onions are KINDS of vegetables; roses, dahlias, iris are KINDS (Genus, species or hybrids) of flowers. The term CULTIVAR is used for varieties of kinds of flowers, fruit and vegetables. Peace and Virgo are CULTIVARS of roses, Onward and Alderman are CULTIVARS of peas.
9. **VASES.** A range will be available from the Society **FOR SECTIONS 3 AND 4 ONLY**, but we cannot guarantee there will be sufficient for all exhibitors.
10. **PLATES AND CAKE COVERS.** Where indicated these will be supplied by the EHS, in the sizes required. This only applies to sections **2, 9** and **8** (cakes and biscuits)
11. **DECISIONS AND PROTESTS.** On the relative merits of the exhibits, **THE JUDGES' DECISION IS FINAL**, but the Committee reserves to itself the decision on any other dispute. A protest **MUST** be made in writing and given to the Marquee Manager by 13:00 on Show Day.
12. **ELIGIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS.** On all questions regarding the eligibility of an Exhibitor the decision of the Committee shall be final.
13. **EXHIBITS MUST BE THE PROPERTY OF THE EXHIBITOR.** Unless otherwise stated, all exhibits must be the property of the Exhibitor and must have been in his/her possession for at least **2 MONTHS PRIOR TO THE SHOW**. The Committee reserves the right to visit, before or after the Show, gardens and/or allotments from which exhibits have been entered for competition.
14. **NUMBER OF ENTRIES IN A CLASS.** An Exhibitor may stage only one entry in any one Class.
15. **NUMBER OF ENTRIES PER HOUSEHOLD.** Unless otherwise stated in the Schedule, two or more persons may not compete separately in the same Class with produce from the same garden and/or allotment. This ruling does not apply to Classes such as floral arrangement where Exhibitors are allowed to use plant material, which has not been grown by themselves. If members of a family wish to share the credit and prizes then the exhibit should be entered in joint names.



16. **CONSTITUTION OF AN EXHIBIT.** Where a number or quantity of plants, flowers, fruit or vegetables is specified in the Schedule for a Class, vase, dish or collection neither more nor less than the number or quantity may be shown and an exhibit will be disqualified for any excess or deficiency. If, before an exhibit is judged, any excess or deficiency is noticed and considered to be the result of an accident and not an attempt to deceive, the steward may give the Exhibitor (if at hand) an opportunity to correct the mistake but the officials shall not be under any obligation to do so and any disqualification resulting from an excess or deficiency shall be the Exhibitor's responsibility. The Judges may not correct any error, but they may direct the attention of the referee or steward to it.
17. **CONSTITUTION OF DISHES.** Every dish must consist of one cultivar (variety) only, unless mixed dishes are permitted by the Schedule.
18. **THE RIPENESS OF FRUIT.** Apples, pears and gooseberries may be shown either ripe or unripe and all other fruit must be ripe unless otherwise specified in the Schedule. Over ripeness will be regarded as a defect in any fruit.
19. **THE CLASSIFICATION OF DESSERT & COOKING CULTIVARS (VARIETIES) OF FRUIT.** Apples, pears and plums must be shown as dessert or cooking cultivars in accordance with the classified lists in the RHS Show Handbook (revised 2016) – (see p 81 - 85 for classification of dual purpose apples).
20. **FRUITS CLASSIFIED AS VEGETABLES.** The following though botanically classified as fruits, are for the purposes of Horticultural Shows, classified as vegetables:

21. **EXHIBITS NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE.** Any exhibit which does not conform to the wording of the Schedule (unless corrected in accordance with Rule 16) shall be disqualified and a Steward or Judge should write on the Entry Card 'Not according to Schedule' (NAS) and add a factual note as to why it is marked 'NAS'.
22. **PRIZE MONEY.** Can be collected between **16:45 and 17:15** in the **Horticultural Marquee**
23. **ALTERATION OF EXHIBITS.** After judging has taken place no exhibit or part of an exhibit may be altered or removed until the end of the Show, except by special permission of the Show Manager
24. **LIABILITY FOR LOSS.** All exhibits, personal property etc. shall be at the risk of the Exhibitors and the Society shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. Should a Show for any cause not be held, no Exhibitor shall have any claim on the Society. Exhibitors will be wholly responsible for all claims made by their own employees under the Common Law or under any statute for compensation arising out of or in the course of such employment for injury or otherwise. The Society has no responsibility to any but its own employees.
25. **VEHICLE MOVEMENT.** Vehicles may not move on the showground until after 17:15pm and then at slow speed. Please TAKE CARE of the PUBLIC on leaving the showground.

## 26. THE RHS POINTS SYSTEM FOR JUDGING VEGETABLE AND FRUIT COLLECTIONS.

The exhibition value of any kind of vegetable or fruit is governed by the difficulty of producing a perfect dish. The following RHS Show Handbook (revised maximum points will be used for assessing the points value of dishes in Vegetable and Fruit Collections in this Schedule.) See the Handbook for all other vegetables and fruit.
